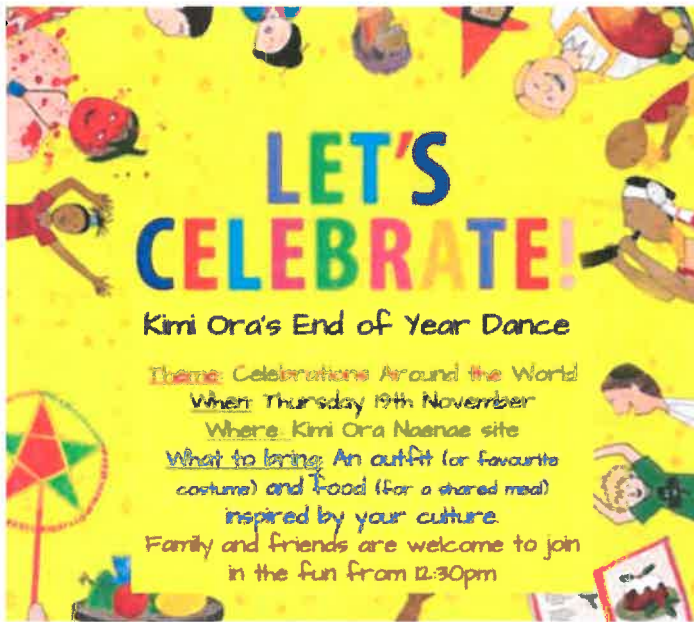


Kimi News, Week 5, Term 4, 2015

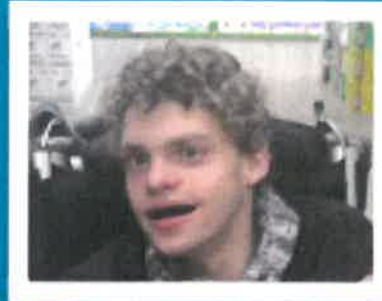

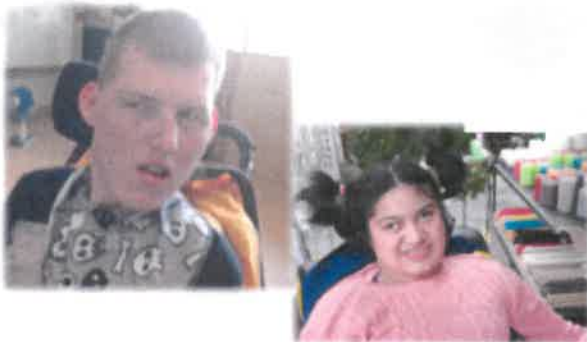
