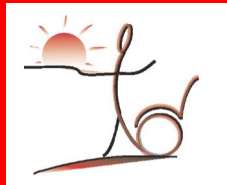


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Kimi Ora School

What is happening this term....

Our main focus for our staff and students this term is getting to know each other. With the many changes in staffing, classes, new satellites and students we have our staff focusing on getting to know their students and forming relationships with them and their whanau. This will enable our students to reach their goals and develop independence in all areas throughout their time at Kimi Ora.

This term our school-wide topic is 'My Place, My Friends.' Our students are learning all about their community, especially the students that are new or have joined new classes or sites. This topic is based on the Social Sciences aspect of the New Zealand Curriculum and is integrated into all our students' learning over many subjects including literacy, maths, art, music and outings.

Key Competencies are part of the New Zealand Curriculum and are recognised as the capabilities for living and life long learning. The NZ Curriculum identifies 5 Key Competencies that set the direction of learning for all students; these are: Thinking, Participating and Contributing, Managing self, Using Language Symbols and Text and Relating to Others.

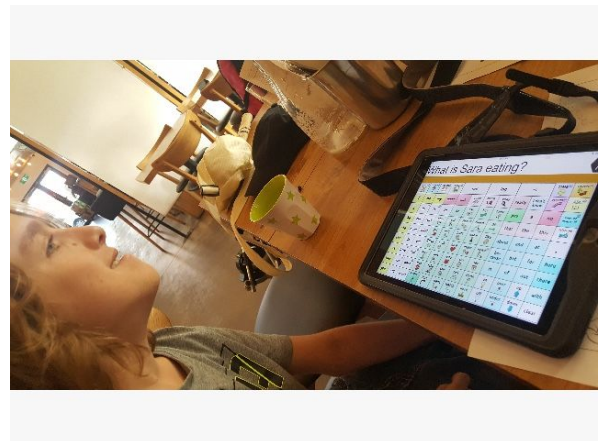
Like the Literacy and Numeracy Curriculum, Kimi Ora use an expanded, specially developed 'Key Competencies Pathway' that allows us to assess and develop next steps for all our students. It has been designed to demonstrate how the Key Competencies are relevant and accessible to all learners with special needs.

This term our school wide Key Competency focus is 'Relating to Others.' This ties in well with our school topic of 'My place, My Friends.' Students are working on goals around one of the following headings: "To express myself," 'To respond to others' and 'To learn from others.'

Communication between home and school at Kimi Ora....

At Kimi Ora School we have many ways in which you can communicate with us. These include:

Home/School Communication books: At the start of this term you would have received your child's weekly timetable for term 1. The activities listed are carried out on a daily basis each week for the whole term. Any deviation from the timetable will be noted in your child's book. Any health or personal cares will also be noted. If there is any other information you would like included in the daily communication book then please just let your child's teacher know.

We are trialling this system for Term One as we are looking at ways in which our teachers can maximise their teaching time and take a regular break at lunchtime to refuel before afternoon groups.

We still love hearing about what has been happening at home, exciting news, how their sleep was and any other information you may think is relevant for the school team.

Email/Phone: You can email your child's teacher with anything you would like to discuss, or call them on the school landline during school hours. Alternatively, should you prefer, a meeting can be arranged.

Storypark: We use Storypark as an ePortfolio for your child. Here we collect and share evidence towards their IEP and Curriculum related goals. We also share magic moments or exciting events from their week. We love hearing about and seeing photos from home as well!

IEP Meetings: In Terms 1/2 we have the initial IEP meeting with the school team and parents/caregivers (and any other people you would like to attend.) This is to develop a vision and specific goals that you would like the school team to work on with your child. In Terms 3/4 we have an IEP review meeting with you and the school team. IEP meetings are on set days and you will hear from your child's teacher about what day it will be and be asked to choose the best time to suit you. At Kimi Ora we work with families the way in which they feel the most comfortable, so please let us know if you have any specific requests or would like your child's meeting to run in a different way.
