Congratulations to Joshua P, Daley, Mily and Te Kauri for winning the student of the week awards!



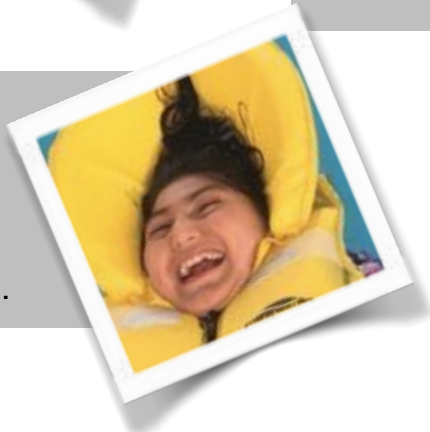
Daley Te Runa for great contribution and attendance at sessions all day.
