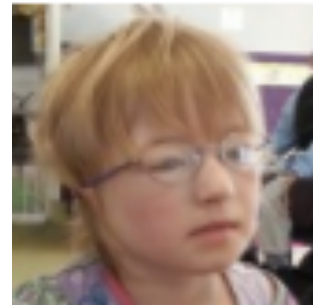
You also need to ask a staff member to use their swipe to let you out.
